2017 has been both a busy and successful year for the Irish Pilgrimage Trust, with over 1,100 pilgrims joining us on our Easter Pilgrimage this year. We were blessed with an exceptionally enjoyable pilgrimage this Easter, with wonderful weather and a somewhat under worked medical team: no doubt those two phenomena are related. Lourdes was a riot of colour and song for Easter week as over 40 groups from The Irish Pilgrimage Trust joined numerous others from our sister Trusts from all over the world.

Once again, we were ably lead by Bishop Donal McKeown, our Trust president, who did a wonderful job both in leading our main liturgies and providing pastoral support to various groups within the Trust over the course of his time with us.

To travel on the pilgrimage with the Trust has been a great privilege and benefit for many young people, and I would ask all of those associated with the Trust to assist us in ensuring that deserving young people do not miss out for want of knowing about the pilgrimage.

If you know a young person who would benefit from travelling with us please feel free to download an application form (just google www.irishpilgrimagetrust.com/forms and follow the link to download the form) and have the applicant's family fill the form out. It's very simple and you could make an enormous difference in a young per-

son's life by simply doing this.

We are also of course already well into the fundraising drive for 2018. Volunteers with the Trust have always been justifiably proud of the fact that we fundraise not to cover our personal pilgrimage costs but to allow young people to travel with us free of charge. This allows young people who otherwise could not afford to come to Lourdes the opportunity to do so, and it is a vital part of what we do. Fundraising is never easy, and the Trust does not have significant reserves, meaning that it is a constant struggle to ensure we can fund the Pilgrimage each year.

I would ask all friends of the Trust to consider donating to the charity (there's a big purple 'Donate' button on our website!), or indeed to consider including The Irish Pilgrimage Trust in your will. The Trust VOLUNTEERS - Who Are They

They are the women and men from all walks of life who are driven by their desire to help those with special needs, who may need of additional assistance or support and who may benefit from our care. The Irish Pilgrimage Trust is a Volunteer led organisation run by a Board of VOLUNTEER Trustees drawn from our groups and regions around the country. Each year more than 850 like minded people volunteer with The Irish Pilgrimage Trust.

Our Volunteers include Doctors, Nurses, Chaplains, Teachers, other professionals and skilled people. The Trust's youth and student volunteer program has been a particular blessing. A number of transition year students join our Lourdes and Friendship Weeks as student helpers and bring their caring gifts, new life, energy, fun and support to their groups. We are also fortunate to have Students Nurses join us and their volunteering is also recognised by their course. ALL Volunteers with the Trust are vetted and are also bound by the Trust's Code of Practice and Safeguarding policies and attend training.



What do our Volunteers do?

Volunteers organise and take part in the annual Easter Pilgrimage and summer Hosanna House pilgrimages to Lourdes as well as the Cois Cuain and Kilcuan Summer Friendship Weeks for young people with special needs.

The Trust Volunteers give up their free time and holidays to provide care, support and companionship to the Guests of the Trust and do so at their own cost.

All of this is only possible due to their fundraising efforts as the Trust is totally reliant on fund raising and private donations. The funds raised cover the full cost of Guests while all volunteers pay their own fares. This is just one of the exceptional sacrifices and commitments made by every volunteer.

Many Volunteers return year on year to participate. Many former students return as adult volunteers and a number have also become group leaders. The Trust is a community for all ages, all abilities bound by a shared commitment to care and support those who require additional help or have additional needs. This is acted out in practical ways by sharing time and experiences together that change lives very often in positive ways.

Being a volunteer is not always easy but is always rewarding in the most unexpected ways. Each volunteer brings their own individual gifts to their group without which the group is incomplete.

Our Special Volunteer Supporters

The Trust is very fortunate and grateful to receive the kindness and generosity of the very many volunteer supporters who give freely of their time helping out at Church gate collections, assisting with organising fundraising events, cyclists and others throughout the regions. Many of our supporters have not travelled with the Trust but understand the vital nature of our work. 

The Irish Pilgrimage Trust provide special pilgrimage holidays to children and young



A completed application form must first be submitted to our Head Office in Kilcuan for a family member, relative or friend with special needs who wishes to be considered for our Easter Pilgrimage, our Hosanna House summer pilgrimages or Friendship Weeks here in Ireland.

DID YOU KNOW that guests who travelled with the Trust in 2013 or earlier are now eligible to apply for a place once again in 2018!

Following detailed consideration invitations are issued to those whom the Trust believe it can best care and provide for during the Easter and other pilgrimages. Invitations are issued before Christmas to those selected to join the Trust as Guests on our Easter Pilgrimage to Lourdes. ALL Guests for the Easter Pilgrimage to Lourdes travel free of charge, including flights, accommodation, meals and activities.

The criteria is as follows:

- Children aged 11 years old to 30 years old with a physical disability or illness or a learning disability
- Infants up to the age of 11 years old with serious illness or life threatening conditions will be considered for one of our Family Groups; The selected child and a parent will be invited as Guests

CYCLE 2018

is up and 'running' following it's very successful launch in Lourdes last Easter. We are thrilled with the response to date, and also with the fact that we have so

many new 'first-time' cyclists this year. This is very much welcomed by the Trust as well as being hugely encouraging for this unique biennial event. In 2018 our cycle route to Lourdes will be almost 1,000 km over 7 days. It's importance as a fund raiser for The Irish Pilgrimage Trust cannot be overstated.

The Cycling begins in ernest on 25th and 26th November 2017 when the first meeting and practice cycle takes place in Kilcuan. It will be the first opportunity for cyclists, back-up crew and organisers to get together as a group. This is a very important weekend in our preparation for France. We begin implement-

ing our plans and fine tuning the roles and responsibilities for everbody involved. On Sunday morning 26th our cyclists will set off from Kilcuan on a 100km cycle through county Galway supported by the backup team.

WE wish everyone involved every success with reaching their fundraising targets and that the cyclists will get the good weather they deserve to suit their training during the coming months.
