# Lourdes 2011 with The Irish Pilgrimage Trust

Lourdes, Easter week, hosted the 40th Anniversary of The Irish Pilgrimage Trust. Over 1000 people traveled on this amazing pilgrimage from all over Ireland, of which 500 were children with special needs. I had the privilege this year of leading a youth group from Mayo which comprised of 10 students from 5th year in St Josephs Secondary school Castlebar, 10 students from 5th year in St Michaels Secondary School Claremorris and 6 leaders, Fr.Micheal Murphy, Lisa Walsh, Marese O'Hora, Elaine Madden, Ann Marie Lardner and of course myself (Aiden Grealis).

Our Group was set up last September when we called to both schools and spoke to the 5th Year students about a youth group to go to Lourdes. We gave them information about The Irish Pilgrimage Trust, what the organisation is all about and what happens in Lourdes during the Easter Pilgrimage. We gave application forms to the girls to fill in from which we received a large number



of applications. Unfortunately we could only bring 20 students on the trip, 10 from each school.

Once the group was formed, we had meetings every month in either Claremorris or Castlebar at which our students had an opportunity to bond as a group, while learning about the Trust, the



pilgrimage and what it all entailed. We had people from the Irish Pilgrimage Trust, including some past members of the youth group, speak to them on their experiences of Lourdes over the years. Marie Jordan, a manual handling instructor from the HSE, held a manual handling training course for them which as well as showing them the importance of lifting properly, also demonstrated the proper way to push a wheelchair, practical things that would be very helpful in Lourdes. Noelle King from Castlebar helped our students with some sign language which also proved to be beneficial over the week in Lourdes with some groups having children who were deaf.

We also met with their parents and discussed everything about their trip to Lourdes. Each student had to pay their own fare & fundraise for the children whose week is paid for. The young people organized many fundraising activities both inside and outside of school.

By the time Easter Sunday arrived everyone was full of excitement as we set off for Lourdes. It was late on Sunday evening when we arrived so we had a quick look around to get our bearings for the week. Monday morning after breakfast, our group split up into twos, each couple working with a different group from the West of Ireland for the week ahead. These groups comprised of 10 children, 10 carer's, a nurse and chaplain and now two youth members. Most groups during the week would have Mass each day and a visit the Grotto where our Lady Appeared to St. Bernadette. Other things to do during the week, were a visit to the Baths, the Stations of the Cross, the places associated with St Bernadette, the Cite Secours while not

forgetting to light a candle for everyone's intentions.

On Tuesday all the Irish groups had one large Mass where Cardinal Sean Brady was the chief celebrant of the Mass, while on Thursday the whole pilgrimage gathered in the underground Basilica for the international Mass. The Irish groups were in charge of organizing the liturgies this year and our youth group was to the fore in the choir and in leading two beautiful mimes. The liturgies in Lourdes are very vibrant and colourful; with around 5,000 people participating in the international Mass. Wednesday is a day out for everyone with groups going to such diverse places as the mountains, beach or Zoo. Thursday night is 'fancy dress' party night, pure fun, while Friday night was full of tears as they all say good bye. Our students received so much from the trip to Lourdes with the Irish Pilgrimage Trust and I know they will treasure this experience in their hearts for the rest of their lives. The Irish Pilgrimage Trust is such a remarkable charity that helps so many people, able and with special needs over the last 40 years.

25th June to 2nd July, 2011

On 25th June, Teresa, James, Joan, Sheila, Bridget, Pat, Mary, Geralyn, Mary and Tommy flew from Dublin to walk over 6 days from Sarria to Santiago de Compostela. We each paid €410 and paid for our own airfare and also raised money for the Trust. In total about €5000 has been raised to date for the Trust which will go towards the cost of our new holiday home Cois Cuain in Kilrane near Rosslare Harbour people and families with special needs.



On arrival in Santiago airport our group of 10 walkers were transported by bus to Hotel Mar de Plata in Sarria. The bus journey took an hour and a half and it would take us 6 days walking to return to Santiago! The group were to walk a total of 117 Km over the 6 days with a walk of 29km to be completed on Thursday 30th June. This was very difficult particularly in the first couple of days where temperatures were over 40degrees and shade was limited. However on Friday the (by now) sturdy walkers only had 11km to walk and did this easily. We arrived in time for the Pilgrim's mass in the Cathedral which was very special for us and we then went proudly to the passport office to get our passports stamped and to receive our certificate of completion of the Camino. We were so proud of that. In spite of blood and sweat, blisters, heat exhaustion, fatigue, we had DONE IT!!!

# Lourdes History 2011



The Irish Trust started quietly and we had no idea that it would develop into the wonderful organization it is now 40 years later. As a nurse working in England I became aware of the HCPT, (founded in 1954 by Dr Michael Strode) and travelled to Lourdes with them 1962 – 1964. It was a time of great transformation in the Church following Vatican 2 and the Trust was to the forefront with gentle guidance and support with all that was new. It was a life changing time for many of us. In 1968 and still in touch with the HCPT but now married and living in Dublin I made contact with them with an offer to send Green Shield trading stamps to help with their fund raising. It was not to be! Instead it was suggested that I get a few people together and set up an “Irish” Trust. That one telephone call was all it took; the rest as it is said is history!

So in 1971 the Irish Handicapped Children's Pilgrimage Trust (IHCPT) now named the Irish Pilgrimage Trust was set up, the founding trustees were: Fr. Fonsie Doran CSsR, Mary Dunne, Brian Joyce, Peter McKimm, Anthea and Bill O'Grady. In 1972 the first 14 young people from the 32 counties of Ireland travelled to Lourdes at Easter. With the children there were 14 adults, Group Leaders Fintan McAneney and Tom McAteer, chaplains Frs.' Joe Mullen and Fonsie Doran, who



were supported by Dr Kevin Greenan, nurses, and other intrepid travelers! It was our first holiday/pilgrimage, the hard work had paid off and it had been an amazing success! We were overjoyed and despite the tough times in the 1970's we went headlong into our next and subsequent pilgrimages!

Over the years things have changed and developed, but the balance of a pilgrimage with lively yet reflective liturgies, plus fun and great friendships has remained the same. In the 1970's young people with physical or learning disabilities were often resident in special schools and hospitals, so to fly to Lourdes, stay in hotels and be out and about hail, rain, sun or snow (we get the lot!) was a very different experience. At this time, and with the support of our President Bishop Dermot O'Mahony, we received the patronage of the Irish Hierarchy. This facilitated the



spread of the Trust throughout the island of Ireland.

Over the years it has not always been plain sailing. In 1978 we coped with a postal and telephone strike, and with no mobiles (can you imagine it?) and most calls through a telephone operator, it was a challenge! Added to that, there was an airline dispute - with flight time confirmation only 48 hours ahead! Undaunted, we met each crisis and succeeded with the help of many people and lots of prayers.

The Trust grew through faith, hope, generosity and friendship. Many helpers initially were “volunteered” to go to Lourdes but soon got hooked and recruited their families and friends, and so we increased and multiplied! A certain “press ganged” volunteer told his work colleagues he was off to the south of France for his holidays, and only when he returned overwhelmed by the week, did the truth come out that he had not been on a beach (as they had been led to believe) but in Lourdes! Subsequently many of his friends also joined up! We had a number of helpers who were in their early

careers in A I B and as they were moved around the country we took advantage setting up small Trust groups and continuing the spread of our gospel!

Every Easter over 2000 young people from around the world fill the town of Lourdes with their joie de vivre, it is an amazing sight! What is also very evident is the number of young able-bodied men and women who care for the children. These, with their great generosity of spirit and energy are the future of the Trust and their youthful exuberance is infectious as they give their time, money and enthusiasm to all aspects of the work of the Trust.



As the IHCPT started 40 years ago from a connection with the HCPT in England, so also from the Irish Trust in the same way have the American, Slovakian and Croatian Trusts been formed. A second generation helper founded the Trust in Croatia, so we have come full circle! These pioneers have also taken that one big step in faith, hope and enthusiasm to bring this wonderful organization to even more young people with special needs. The IHCPT has always been known as the "Trust" and so Trust we do! May the future bring joy and happiness to those who both give and receive and who are nurtured by the care and love of all those in our Trust.

## Longford to Lourdes

On the 3rd of June 2011 a group of 8 walkers left Longford town on foot and began a 1200km walk all the way to Lourdes. Each day the Group walked in relays, with each walker doing about 15km.



They assembled in Longford walked through Tullamore, Carlow, Enniscorthy and onto Rosslare Harbour where they took the Ferry to France. On arrival in Cherbourg and approximately 950k to go they continued their walk through Avranches, Rennes, Nantes and Bordeaux and finally reached their destination in Lourdes on 12th June. On arrival in Lourdes, they were greeted by a large crowd of well wishers at St. Michael's Gate and the group participated in the Lourdes Ceremonies. On the 24th July 2011 Vinny Finn who organised The Big Walk presented a cheque of €23,000 to The Irish Pilgrimage Trust, North West Region.

We have now opened a new holiday home "Cois Cuan" located at Kilrane in Wexford, near Rosslare Harbour. This house is available to groups of up to 17 people or families for holidays. One of our greatest challenges each year is the dreaded fundraising and in the current times, we believe that this will get more difficult. Also our costs of getting to Lourdes are increasing faster due to increases in fuel prices. Traditionally, most of the fundraising as you know has been done by the groups and this is now more difficult than ever. # Ring of Kerry Cycle 2011

## A fundraiser for the Irish Pilgrimage Trust.

The Irish Pilgrimage Trust was one of the seven charities involved in organising the annual Ring of Kerry cycle and is set to raise over €50k from the fundraising event, which will help ensure that many deserving children and families can benefit from the annual trip to Lourdes.

The cycle is a fantastic fundraising event with a real challenge for those who abandoned their bikes in the garden shed many years ago. Over 5,000 participants cycled the beautiful, rugged Ring of Kerry on Saturday the 2nd of July 2011. Almost 300 cyclists participated on behalf of the Trust - the highest number of all the participating



charities involved. It included many former (and future!), Lourdes cyclists taking part in the event.

The cyclists set off from Killarney at 6 o'clock on the Saturday morning, with the last batch of cyclists leaving at 8am. The 112 mile trip takes roughly 10 hours, so cyclists return back to Killarney after 4pm extremely weary but very fulfilled.

A full range of support services was provided by volunteers on the day, including a backup service until the last cyclist arrived back in Killarney. Refreshment stops were dotted along the route,



with buttered brack, homemade sandwiches and drinks provided for the hungry and thirsty cyclists. As an added incentive, cyclists who raised €750 for the Irish Pilgrimage Trust were offered two nights' free accommodation. Happily, the sun shone on the day - adding to the enjoyment of this great event.

Keep the annual Ring of Kerry cycle in mind as we head into winter - it is a fantastic experience, well worth taking part in, while raising thousands of euros for a range of worthy charities.

We departed with a group of 45 people from 10th to 17th June 2011. The breakdown of the group consisted of clients, active age and helpers. The age of the clients varied from early twenties to eighty.

As we were flying from Dublin Airport to Toulouse at 12.50 pm., the day started very early to collect the group along the way. At that early hour of the morning everyone was very excited about the trip and by the time we got to the airport all were on first name terms and decked with their hats and neck scarves. We were met in Toulouse by staff from Hosanna House and we travelled on to Lourdes by bus.

Of course, as all group leaders would agree the work that goes into preparing for the week is immense but once the group is chosen, helpers are in place, transport booked and the programme for the week prepared, it is all systems go.

The programme for the week consists of: daily mass and visits to the grotto, Blessed Sacrament and Torchlight processions, the baths, the stations, a visit to the City of the poor, Garvanie and many more attractions around Lourdes and Hosanna House, depending on the weather. We had a beautiful evening for the Bar-B-Que with the discovery of new culinary talents in the group. It was a tonic, just sitting in the sunshine and soaking up the tranquil views of the mountains and with singing, dancing and a treasure hunt afterwards to finish the evening in style.

The truth is, the purpose of the pilgrimage to Lourdes is to take these special people away on a holiday they perhaps otherwise might not have had. Where they will have lots of fun and perhaps some good memories about positive spiritual experiences they have been a part of too. They seemed to visibly blossom, becoming more confident and relaxed as the week went by.

The week in Lourdes was probably one of the best weeks of my life, filled with laughter, fun, amazing people and incredible enjoyment, not forgetting the intense spirituality that underpins the Lourdes experience. It is an honour to be a part of these special people's lives, if even for a short time and the week that they have is something that they too will remember for the rest of their lives.

I enjoyed so much putting others first and I feel privileged to have been part of lots of unscripted special moments that occurred out of the everyday. The Lourdes experience has also greatly invigorated my own faith and relationship with God. I had forgotten how much joy and meaning can come from singing!

Describing a week in Lourdes is not easy to put into words ... all I can say is it never fails to amaze and I feel privileged to be a part of it.
